Transhumanismus (Transhumanism) STII Michaeli 2022

There is probably hardly an area of life any more in which we have not or could not hand over responsibility and decision-making, even in the form of suggestions, to a better and more effective technical system. Rationality and crystalline-cool intellectuality thrust themselves between us and the world, occupying our heart space, from which true thinking and true action is possible. We have become, metaphorically speaking, a kind of cephalopod. To halt developments by withdrawing from modern, mechanized life would be, according to Rudolf Steiner, "guite the wrong thing to do". But how can we meet these demands of modern life without losing ourselves in the mindset of transhumanism, without being absorbed by technology, and thus insidiously relinquishing our responsibility to take hold of our lives?

In May 1922 Rudolf Steiner gave the painter Henni Geck nine training sketches for painters at her request, which she was to use in her painting lessons. The first nine sketches with the theme "Moods of Nature" sketched by Rudolf Steiner in a few minutes with pastel on wrapping paper, show central motifs from nature

Now after 100 years, with the ecological crisis, these sketches are more relevant than ever, and this for every human being. Because, what do they show us? They are not illustrations of external natural events! If one looks at the sketches, one wakes up to a happening that reveals itself only in a deeper look at nature. Here art is the speaking inspiration and mediator.



SINNE und ICH (Senses and Self) STIL Faster 2022

How relevant and life-decisive the relationship of man to his senses is becomes evident in the essays of STIL. The starting point of the contributions is the unfinished work "Anthroposophy. A Fragment", which Rudolf Steiner wrote in 1910, but could not finish and was first published in 1951. Through technology and digitalization of life, the subject of sensory experience today is even more existential than at the beginning of the 20th century, in a world where encounters with the world through the human senses have declined considerably. Whether we will be able to distinguish a machine from a human being and whether we can adequately assess and manage the encroachment of technology into all areas of life will depend in the future on the development of our
