What moves eurythmy?

PLENUM

A multi-perspective view of the eurythmy movement

In the plenary session we will look at eurythmy and its possible effects from the perspectives of science/medicine, theatre and education over three days:

- *Dirk Cysarz* and *Max Heidelberg* from the Faculty of Health – Department of Human Medicine at the University of Witten/Herdecke report on their research into the effect of eurythmy as structured movement on cardiac regulation.
- The artistic directing team of the production “Parsifal” at the Goetheanum talks about encounters and experiences between opera, stage and eurythmy: with *Jasmin Solfaghari* (director), *Walter Schütze* (stage design), *Severin Fraser* (Else-Klink-Ensemble, Eurythmeum Stuttgart) and *Stefan Hasler* (Goetheanum-Eurythmy-Ensemble).
- *Karin Michael* (Medical Section at the Goetheanum), *Simone Helmle* from the Landbauschule Bodensee and *Friedemann Wecker* from Bauck KG will explore the topic of “Education and Movement”.

On the final morning we want to question ourselves in a plenary session entitled “Movement into the future” – where can eurythmy take us now?

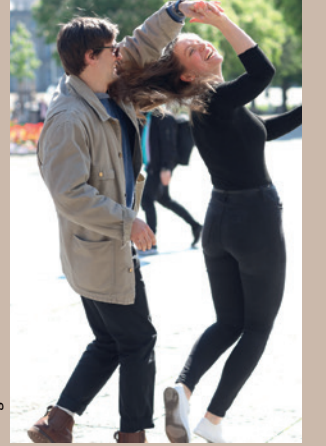
