Dear Fellow Creative Speech Specialists, Dear All working with language, Dear All interested in language,

In these days our everyday life is determined by the so-called corona crisis. We are experiencing an exceptional state which throws up questions, confronts us with new challenges, but also offers opportunities. COVID-19 targets the rhythmical system, the organ which directly connects us with our environment and fellow human beings. Many people are experiencing a rise in anxiety, fears and loneliness. With therapeutic speech we have a method at our disposal to strengthen the breathing and self-efficacy and thereby dismantle anxieties and support empathy. The conference topic of "Research" was decided long before "corona", but this crisis confirms once again the necessity not only of successfully using creative speech in therapy and education but also reporting about it to a greater extent!

The "Research" conference topic is associated with the desire to reflect as consciously as possible on the questions and findings we have brought along, to enter into a dialogue about them and continue to develop them. It aims to communicate tools for own studies and research steps and to encourage everyone to make their research results public.

Every person who works creatively is confronted with questions arising from their occupational activity, leading to hypotheses and findings. Some colleagues have probably been able to specialise in particular areas and to develop more or less advanced expertise. The conference offers these "experts" the opportunity to find each other and exchange views.

One workshop will set out the steps for setting up single-case studies, jointly or alone, and preparing them for publication. Since our senses are probably the most central and important research instruments, there will be a workshop on training Goethean observation. One workshop will shine a research light on speech exercises we have developed ourselves, another one will translate Rudolf Steiner's speech exercises into other languages. People from different countries are warmly invited to create texts in their mother tongue and to pass on the results in their home country. We want to encourage colleagues from as many language areas as possible to become actively involved. One workshop will study the connection between language development and movement, another one is calling for collaboration to demonstrate and continue to develop the potential of creative speech for Waldorf schools.

In his introductory lecture, Matthias Girke will trace a line from research to the meditative path of knowledge. Dietrich von Bonin and Erik Baars will inspire and instruct us in how to approach our own research and Armin Husemann will report about his research on the effect of the articulation of the speech sounds on the movement of the blood.

We have planned a "Poster Session" and will learn about the questions and research areas which are currently occupying colleagues. Dietrich von Bonin provides a guide below how everyone can participate in the poster presentation.

At the last conference in Dornach in October 2019, we met in small groups at the end to work on topics relevant for the future. In the subsequent plenary session, the resulting motifs were collected and compiled in a minute which was then sent to participants. We will build on that work this year and would be pleased to receive your reports in this connection. Keyword: Future workshop.

Immediately after the conference you can immerse yourself in Goethe's *Faust*. You will see a new production, shortened to nine hours. Faust 1 will be performed on Saturday, 24 October from 18.00 to 22.00, Faust 2 on Sunday, 25 October from 09.30 to 18.00. Ticket prices and the opportunity to register will are online now on the <u>Goetheanum website</u>. Advance information can be found on the <u>faust.jetzt</u> website. As last year, people are also welcome at the conference who themselves don't have a training in creative speech but who are interested in the subject.

Ideas posters for research in creative speech in education and therapy

Dietrich von Bonin

During this year's study days we would like to try out a new format with you. There will be a poster presentation at which experienced researchers will not be the only ones to present their ideas and findings – no, it's for you too. Perhaps you have gathered experience with a disorder, have experienced the particular power of an exercise or method and want to communicate your findings but don't know how they could be turned into a research project or case study?

Before the conference, please make a brief note of your thoughts on the following seven questions which you will then write on a flip chart during the conference and discuss with colleagues walking past. You will take valuable suggestions home with you and – who knows – it might lead to a project which helps all of us!

Ouestions:

- 1. What have I observed? (Disorder, illness suitable exercises or texts)
- 2. How might this be turned into a research project? (Jot down your own ideas in a few sentences)
- 3. Can I formulate a central research question on the basis of these ideas? (Feel free to try; if not, this point can be skipped)
- 4. Does previous work or do publications already exist on this subject? (Write down, if known)
- 5. What result do I hope for? (In relation to points 2 and 3)
- 6. Whom would I need to be involved or to help? (Should several people carry out the same exercises, do I have material for a single-case presentation but difficulties with formulation, etc.)
- 7. What preliminary work have I already done for the concrete execution of the project? (Note of project outline, patient files, etc., if available)

1. Multilingual research on the laws of Rudolf Steiner's speech exercises EN / DE

Colleagues from a great variety of countries will study the speech exercises as the basis for translation into the various languages. The aim of the work is to stimulate translation activity and compile a collection of translated exercises.

2. My path to the single-case study DE

We will work with a proven grid for submissions to the journal *Der Merkurstab* and, using the examples you have brought along, will consider how they can be well formulated and what is important in preparing a case study. Please bring your notes on interesting progressions. Also medical reports, written feedback from patients, etc. Case reports on the most frequent clinical pictures of anxiety, depression and exhaustion are of particular interest.

3. The accord between language development and movement development DE

How can we support our exercises from creative speech therapy in the various age groups, using gesticulation, gestures, play and the elements of Greek gymnastics?

4. Language development in Waldorf schools DE

This workshop addresses creative speech practitioners who are interested in being involved in a research project of the Freie Hochschule Stuttgart - Seminar for Waldorf Pedagogy on language development in Waldorf schools. The purpose of the group is to establish contact and develop ideas. This practice-oriented research project aims to demonstrate and develop further the potential of creative speech for schools in view of the increasing impoverishment of language skills. Ideally the work of this group would form the starting point for a longer-term collaboration. *Rainer Patzlaff and Ulrike Hans*

5. Own exercises in therapy. How are they created, how can they be studied and used? *DE*

We will present own exercises which have already been used in therapy and have proven their worth. First the lecturers will each demonstrate an exercise and explain their criteria and experiences with it, possibly with individual case studies. Then exercises from the participants can be presented.

Some questions for the own exercises:

- How do I develop own exercises? Are there language criteria?
- What makes them valuable for creative speech?
- What is the therapeutic effect of an exercise?
