## Dear Colleagues in all medical specialties!

How can we, as teachers, teach Anthroposophic Medicine in an appropriate way? How do we do it so that we simultaneously learn and teach in a way that supports working well with colleagues in different professional groups? Because if a start is not made in training, it is difficult to catch up later on. The Medical Section at the Goetheanum has since 2014 offered a part-time, interprofessional further training, "Teach the Teacher in Teaching Anthroposophic Medicine", in three successive annual modules, in which it is possible to make a start at any time. Here the interchange with approx. 60 participants from about 20 countries represents a great asset. At the heart of the course lies the endeavour of patient-centred training and further training as well as the use of teaching methodology extended by imagination, inspiration and intuition-based knowledge.

The thematic focus of this year's course is the art of lecturing and the key question how lecturing can become a good training instrument so that a lecture becomes a sustained source of learning for those attending. This comprises both analysis of the opportunities offered by this technique as well as the challenge to make use of it in a meaningful, professional and competent way.

The course provides a direct experience of methodological teaching instruments and techniques in practical tasks and secures what has been learnt through appropriate teaching methods. In doing so, participants and speakers form a common actively learning and teaching community on a common path of practice. Questions concerning teaching techniques as well as securing what has been worked on hereby pervade the whole progression of the course.

As current travel restrictions will make it impossible for many people to attend the conference, we will offer a separate course module on online teaching at a later date.

There will be professional German|English consecutive interpretation, with technical support for whispered translation into other languages. Everyone who wants to learn to teach Anthroposophic Medicine on training and further training courses in ever better ways is warmly invited to this course!

The prerequisite for attendance is a successfully completed training in one of the health professions recognised by the Medical Section at the Goetheanum, professional experience in Anthroposophic Medicine, as well as the corresponding teaching experience or the

concrete intention to take up such teaching activity (including on a practical level in a clinic/practice or as a mentor). Please register soon because the number of participants has been restricted to ensure that the course is of high quality.

The speakers have waived their fee for this course which is budgeted to cover its costs and is financially self-supporting without donations. Any surpluses will be used for the new "Teach the Teacher" website created in parallel with the course with materials (German|English) for independent study. A reduction of the attendance fee may be granted on request in justified cases.
